NEW YORK STATE LAW

RULES OF THE NAUTICAL ROAD

- ✓ Operation of a pleasure vessel on Indian Lake must be careful and prudent. Violations constitute a misdemeanor.
- ✓ Speed limited to 5 mph within 200 feet of the shore, a dock, pier, raft, float or anchored boat.
- ✓ Speed limit of 45 mph during daylight and 25 mph during nighttime.
- ✓ Speed limited to 5 mph through the Jessup narrows.
- ✓ Navigation lights must be used on power boats between sunset and sunrise. Sailboats and boats rowed or paddled must carry a lantern.

BOATING REGULATIONS

- ✓ All operators must be at least 10 yrs old.
- ✓ As of Jan. 1, 2020. Brianna's Law phases in a required Boating Safety Certificate.

If you were born on or after:	You will need a boating safety certificate when operating a motorized vessel in:
Jan. 1, 1993	2020
Jan. 1, 1988	2022
Jan. 1, 1983	2023
Jan. 1, 1978	2024

✓ All operators of motorized vessels, regardless of age, will need a boating safety certificate by Jan. 1, 2025.

- ✓ Never operate a boat while impaired or intoxicated by drugs or alcohol.
- ✓ Must have an observer over 10 yrs old when pulling a skier or tuber.
- ✓ No skiing, surfboarding, parasailing, tubing or use of a related towed device between sunset and sunrise
- ✔ Don't harass wildlife. Avoid active nests.
- ✓ No debris or sewage dumped in lake.

PERSONAL WATERCRAFT

- ✓ Operator must be a minimum of 14 yrs AND have completed an approved boater safety course OR otherwise be accompanied, on board, by someone 18 yrs or older who has completed such a course.
- ✓ Driver and each other person must wear a securely fastened PFD at all times.
- ✓ All personal watercraft must be equipped with: a horn; a device for arresting carburetor backfire; and a distress flag florescent orange at least one square foot in size.
- ✓ No operation between sunset and sunrise.
- ✓ No operation within 500 feet of a designated swim area.
- ✔ Reckless operation strictly prohibited.
- ✓ No wake jumping too close to other vessels.

- ✓ No last minute swerving games.
- ✓ No maneuver which unreasonably or unnecessarily endangers life, limb or property, including carrying more passengers than is recommended by the manufacturer.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT

- ✓ An approved Type III (PFD) personal flotation device for each passenger. Between Nov. 1 and May 1, operators of pleasure boats and all passengers must wear appropriate PFD's at all times.
- ✓ Boats over 16 ft. must also carry one throwable PFD.
- ✓ All children under 12 must wear their PFD.
- ✓ A whistle or horn.
- ✓ A visual distress signal suitable for day and night use, as approved by the US Coast Guard (except for open sailboats not equipped with mechanical power).
- ✓ A fire extinguisher for all in boards, inboard/outboard or decked outboard.
- ✓ Anchor and line.
- ✓ Navigation lights.

REGISTRATION

✓ All powerboats and PWC must display numbers and registration stickers.

REPORTING VIOLATIONS

If you are bothered by boaters operating in an illegal or obnoxious manner, you are encouraged to report them so they can receive a warning (or for repeat offenders, a citation). Even if you can't identify the numbers on a boats hull, it is usually sufficient to provide an accurate description of the craft and its occupants or the location they are staying.
